What to Wear

Plan what you will wear each day. Layer your clothing to handle any situation. Do plan for rain! Highs will likely be in the mid 70s and the nights will get cool. Bring only what you need! Do Not Pack For A Month!!!

- 1) On the bus Wednesday/Thursday - Very comfortable
- 2) Thursday at the beach – outdoor clothing, swimwear if you want to swim – Towel, Sunscreen!
- 3) Friday clinics – Concert Attire! We will dress in performance attire for the event!
- 4) Friday evening – nice school clothes
- 5) Saturday at Disney – plan for any weather conditions! Sun block, shades, hat,

Jacket. You should wear comfortable, durable shoes – you'll walk a lot!
6) Saturday on the bus home – Comfortable (pillow so you can sleep!)
In between, before and after the above listed times use good judgment concerning what you will wear. Since we will be in the band shirts a lot, plan to wear something else on the bus and whenever possible otherwise and wear an undershirt under your band shirt when you can. It will preserve the shirt's...life. At no time will hats be allowed indoors at any of the events but on the bus is OK. Use good judgment! You are representing Timberline High and Boise. No holes in pants/ragged edges or destroyed footwear.

What else?

1. Toiletries: Toothbrush, hair care, **deodorant**, etc. Extra socks are always good.
2. Blankets and pillows for the bus rides
3. Audio/Video players, etc. (may only be used with headphones)
4. Movies/videos (up to PG-13 only) for viewing on the bus
5. Cell Phone/Camera
6. Homework! Please make sure you take care of your responsibilities here!
7. A positive, flexible attitude and spirit of cooperation
8. Snacks for the bus rides
9. Sack dinner for Wednesday night and Thursday breakfast on the bus
10. Llama
11. Swimsuit and TOWEL for hotel pool (if time) and beach (if you choose)
12. Casual clothing for wet, cold and windy weather, and for sunny and warm. Nice school clothes.
13. Prescription Medication. These must be listed on the Travel Consent form! Students may administer their own medication as needed. If you have concerns, please let Mr. Rodriguez know prior to departure.

General Rules/Expectations

- 1) Drug, alcohol or tobacco use at any time during the trip will result in the student being sent home immediately, at the parents' expense. Just don't do it. Travel consent forms must be on file prior to departure for every single student.
- 2) At no time will boys be allowed in girls' hotel rooms or vice versa.
- 3) The "buddy system" is always in place. A minimum of three students are to be together at all times. Five to ten is better.
- 4) BE ON TIME! Responsibility to the itinerary is essential for *everyone* to enjoy the trip. Plan to be 5 or 10 minutes early to every deadline. DO NOT BE LATE.
- 5) Show respect for other people and their space, other people's belongings, the adult chaperones, bus drivers, etc. at all times. (Yes, sir, Yes, ma'am, please, thank you, etc.) and always thank the bus driver for taking us where we need to go. 100% CLASS all the time.
- 6) Common courtesy will go a long way in helping *everyone* to have an enjoyable time.
- 7) You will have the most fun and get the most out of the trip by "playing by the rules".
